## Tips in buying Pre-owned Cars

Most of the time, banks sell foreclosed properties that come with very attractive terms, such as, very affordable down payments and low interest rates.

To people who find it beyond their budget to buy a brand new car, a pre-owned vehicle may be a better option.

PNB-Special Assets Management Group is offering its pre-owned motor vehicles with very competitive prices.

To get your money's worth, make sure you know what to look for. Here are tips in checking out a pre-owned car.

- 1. Begin by making sure the car is on even ground so you can spot any sagging. This will also enable you to perform a good inspection of the tires.
- 2. Look closely at evenness of the wear in the tires. Uneven wear indicates that the wheels are not aligned properly. Also, make sure that the tires are not too worn as these would be dangerous when driving through slick roads and would mean you'll have to replace them soon.
- 3. Move to the car's underside, particularly the floor pans and the frame rails. Armed with a flashlight, check for rust, as well as signs of repair, such as new parts or a fresh coat of paint. Check for rusting in the tailpipe and the muffler as well. Peek into the wheel wells and make sure that nothing's leaking from them.
- 4. Check the exterior:
  - a. Look for dents, scratches and rust.
  - b. Try out every door, window and lock to see if they open and close easily.
  - c. Open the trunk or hatch (if it's a hatchback) to see if the door works okay and to see if it meets your space requirement.
- 5. Inspect the engine:
  - a. Make sure the engine is generally clean and that there are no signs of fluid leaks (you'll need to check these again after your test drive).
  - b. Pull out the dipstick, wipe it clean, put it back in and pull it out again to check if the oil is at the right level and if it has any impurities.
  - c. After making sure that the engine is completely cool, use a rag to remove the radiator cap and inspect it for signs of trouble.
- 6. Start the car and see if it fires up easily. Check all of the knobs and switches to find out if they do what they're supposed to. When you're satisfied, take it for a test drive (keep your eyes and ears out for any problems along the way).
